Seniors - *It's Time to Apply*

Get ready! Fall is an extremely busy time if you are Senior. You have many items on your checklist which need to be addressed if you want to improve your chances of getting into your preferred college and being awarded scholarships.

Apply for the FAFSA as soon as possible. It is your gateway to financial aid such as the Pell Grant and subsidized loans which are loans that do not need to be paid back immediately. If you were unable to complete the FAFSA at your school, Upward Bound has the Pie & Apply FAFSA Night on November 16th at the North College Center at MAC. You can schedule your appointment by emailing your advisor or calling the UB office at 573-518-2156. Remember that you and your parents will need to create an FSA ID and you will need their most recent tax information (2020 tax returns) to apply for financial aid for the 2022-2023 academic year. Also, if you decide to apply for STEP your parents should provide their 2019 tax returns to apply for the 2021-2022 academic year which includes the upcoming Summer program.

It is also critical that you know the priority deadlines for applying to your colleges. Many colleges have deadlines coming up in November. The best way to find out the most accurate information about when and how to apply is to navigate directly to your college's website. There, you should have clear instructions on how to apply online and have access to information on applying for scholarships. If you have any questions, please ask your advisor.

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The mission of Upward Bound at Mineral Area College is to serve eligible high school students by providing academic enrichment, cultural experiences, and a support network to ensure their success in attaining a four year college degree.

A Federally Funded Program

The Mineral Area College Upward Bound I program is a TRIO program funded with a five-year, \$1,495,566 grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. Mineral Area College provides 25% of indirect costs to support the program.

The Mineral Area College Upward Bound II program is a TRIO program funded with a five-year, \$1,298,771 grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. Mineral Area College provides a portion of indirect costs to support the program.

Upward Bound is one of five programs established by Congress to help low-income, first-generation students enter college and graduate. These programs are referred to as the TRIO programs.
