What's the CDA?

The CDA is designed to prepare the student to be trained and educated in early child development accredited programs. The CDA is nationally recognized as meeting quality standards for accredited programs.

Job Opportunities

- Assistant Teacher (preschool or infant/ toddler): Head Start, Even Start, or First Steps
- Lead teachers: licensed and / or accredited privately- owned programs
- Child Care Associate: Community services: eg. YMCA child care programs
- Child CARE Associate: Business: employer- owned child care programs

Job Outlook

The job/ employment outlook for students entering the field of Child Growth and Development in Missouri is expected to increase to over 55, 00 by the year 2012. Teacher assistants, preschool teachers and associate child care workers are expected to rise two to three percent per year. Approximately 640 openings per year for assistants; 400 preschool teachers; and 680 openings for child care workers.
