## **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR AA DEGREE**

1. A student must complete a minimum of 42 semester hours in general education selected from the above categories. The remaining 18-20 hours will be planned according to the student's major and the requirements of the school to which he/she plans to transfer.
2. Six (6) hours of practical arts (Division of Career & Technical) may be applied toward the AA degree.
3. Application for graduation must be filed with the registrar first two weeks after the fall and spring semester begins and during the first week of the summer eight (8) week term. Applications received after that date will be held until the following semester.
4. Completion of an exit exam is required of all degree candidates.
5. Six (6) elective credits may be fulfilled through participation in ensembles, which consist of MUS1050 MAC Singers (Community Choir), MUS1060 Chamber Choir (Vocal Ensembles), MUS1010 Community Band, MUS1020 Jazz Band and MUS1090 Commercial Music Techniques. Students must have prior musical experience. These classes do not satisfy humanities requirements.
6. Last fifteen (15) hours must be earned at MAC.
7. Earn a 2.00 or better cumulative grade point average.
8. Sixty (60) semester hours **PLUS** two (2) hours of PE classes.
