Mineral Area College has chosen Jenzabar EX Total Campus Management Solution for its technology needs. Our staff is currently in the process of converting data in preparation for our target “go live” date of July 1, 2008.

With Jenzabar, you will experience a more powerful student portal. **In June, you will be assigned a new student identifier (number) and PIN number which will allow you access to Jenzabar’s Internet Campus Solution (JICS).** JICS is the student information system you will access to retrieve, for example, a copy of your class schedule, end of the semester grades, and unofficial transcript. Degree audit will also be available to help you plan your educational goals at MAC.

In order to make the transition to the new administrative software, *there will be a short interruption of web and other services.* **Students are encouraged to register as early as possible for fall classes. Please note, web and paper registration will be unavailable from June 24 thorough July 16, 2008.**

## Financial Aid, Payment, Tuition

Mineral Area College participates in many types of student financial aid programs, and we are committed to helping you find the funds to attend college. If you need financial assistance, contact the Financial Aid Office.

Financial aid is available in the form of scholarships, grants, loans and part-time on-campus employment for those who qualify. Most awards are based upon financial need, but certain scholarships may have other eligibility requirements.

### When And How To Seek Financial Aid

You should apply for aid at least six weeks before the semester in which you plan to attend. Late applications will be processed, but funds are limited and late application may affect the amount of aid available to you.

If you wish to be considered for financial aid, apply first for admission to Mineral Area College and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid form (available in the Financial Aid Office or at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)). You will need to complete the aid form each year you are in school.

For the fall 2008 semester, file your application no later than Aug. 1, 2008. Late applications will be accepted, but you will be required to pay for tuition, fees, books and other expenses up front and receive reimbursement later, if you're eligible.

### Payment Deadlines

#### Fall 2008 16-Week Session\*

- Aug. 1** 25 percent of all tuition and fees due. Students who do not meet this deadline will have schedules cancelled.
- Aug. 15** Last day to totally withdraw from college and receive 100 percent refund.
- Aug. 18-29** Students receive 90 percent refund of tuition and fees due for total withdrawal from college.
- Aug. 29** Last day to drop an individual class and receive a 100 percent refund.
- Sept. 1-Dec. 13** No refund for dropped courses or withdrawal from college.
- Sept. 30** All fall fees due.

### What Tuition Rate Do You Pay?

To receive the in-district rate, you or your parent (if you are a dependent) will be required to document residency within the college's taxing district.

The burden of proof of eligibility for in-district tuition rests solely with you. Presence within the taxing district for the past 12 consecutive months and proof of intent to make the taxing district a permanent home are the first criteria.

More information on proving in-district residency is available in the Business Office in the Arts & Sciences Building.

### How to Pay for Classes

#### If You Pay By Mail....

**Pay by Check** — Do not send cash (for your protection). Make checks payable to Mineral Area College. Write your Social Security number on all payments to ensure your account is credited. Write the student's name on the payment if different from the name on the check and mail to:

Your cancelled check is your receipt. Checks must be for the exact total and must be received by the Business Office by the published deadline.

No two-party checks will be accepted. A \$25 fee is charged for each check returned by a banking institution. Returned checks not taken care of within ten days will be turned over to the Prosecuting Attorney's Office.



### If You Pay In Person....

**Pay by Check** — Follow the same procedure as if paying by mail, except present your check in person to the Business Office according to the appropriate deadlines.

**Pay with cash** — The college accepts cash for payments. However, to protect yourself, do not send cash through the mail. Pay in person if you wish to pay by cash.

**Pay by debit or credit card** — Mineral Area College accepts American Express, MasterCard, VISA, Discover or debit cards. If you wish to pay by credit card, pay in person and have your card ready.

**Drop box** — For your convenience in making payments when the Business Office is closed, a payment drop box is located on the Business Office door.

### If You Pay Online....

**www.MineralArea.edu** — If you are a currently enrolled student, you may pay online using your SIS number and an American Express, Visa, MasterCard or Discover credit or debit card (see pg. 12 for more details about SIS).

### Tuition Refund Policy

A 100 percent refund of tuition and fees is given for complete withdrawal from college prior to the first day of class for any semester or session. After the first day of classes and during the first 12.5 percent of a semester or session, a 90 percent refund of all tuition and fees owed will be given for total withdrawal from college. For a 16-week session, 12.5 percent of the session is the last day of the second week of

classes. For an eight-week session, 12.5 percent of the session is the last day of the first week of the classes.

A 100 percent refund will be given for dropping individual classes during the first 12.5 percent of the semester or session so long as a student does not drop to 0 credit hours. After 12.5 percent of the semester or session has passed, no refunds will be given.

## How to Register

### ADMISSION

Mineral Area College is open to all high school graduates and non-graduates who are 16 years or older. Mineral Area College maintains an open door policy, which provides higher education to everyone who can benefit from its programs and courses. However, there are programs of instruction at Mineral Area College which require specific qualifications. Admission to the college does not guarantee that a student will be accepted into a particular course or program. Consult the college catalog for specific information on college policies, degree plans, services and financial aid opportunities.

### ADVISING & ASSESSMENT

Students are assigned a faculty adviser based on their choice of major. Adviser and/or major changes may be made upon request to the Registrar's Office. Advising is a joint responsibility of advisers and students. Students are expected to read the regulations in the catalog and conform to them. Students are responsible for knowing the regulations and policies and for meeting the requirements for a degree or certificate. Advisers guide the student toward accepting responsibility for academic decision making.

### Evening Advising

Student Services offers expanded services for evening students. A counselor will be available for student appointments and drop in sessions from 4-6:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday during the fall semester. Students may call Nancy Crader, (573) 518-2202; Mike Easter, (573) 518-2188; or Mark Easter (573) 518-2211 for an appointment, or drop by the Student Services Office.

### Testing Options

**PLACEMENT TESTS** — The preferred test for placement at Mineral Area College is the ACT, administered in September, October, December, February, April and June of each year.

**ACT COMPASS** — Mineral Area College also offers the COMPASS examination for students unable to complete the ACT prior to registration.

The COMPASS test is an untimed examination taken on the computer. No computer skills are needed to take the test. It is extremely user-friendly and much less stressful than traditional tests. You are allowed to use your own calculator or the onscreen calculator to take the math test.

The COMPASS is designed to measure current skills in reading, writing and math. The results are used to select appropriate levels of English and math courses.

Students may take the COMPASS more than once and they may take the entire battery or any of the three subject area tests. The fee for the entire battery is \$15, and any single test is \$10.

**GED TEST** — To register for this test, you must have received your GED authorization form from Jefferson City prior to scheduling a test date. You will be asked to provide the deposit number from this form in order to register. A \$20 non-refundable fee (cash or money order) is payable when you register for testing.

Registration must be completed prior to the day of testing. You must present a Missouri driver's license or Missouri non-driver ID to the examiner before testing.

**CBASE** — The Missouri General Assembly established the requirement that candidates for entry into state-approved teacher education programs must achieve a satisfactory rating in specified subject area tests.

The College Base (CBASE) exam was adopted by the State Board of Education. Candidates must score 235 or higher in each of four subjects areas: English, mathematics, science and social studies.

The CBASE is offered five times each year. To schedule the CBASE, a \$50 testing fee must be paid in the Student Services Office no later than the Wednesday prior to testing (a late fee of \$15 will be required after the Wednesday deadline). Since this test has limited seating, you are encouraged to register as far in advance as possible to assure a seat.

**EXIT EXAMINATION** — All degree seeking students at Mineral Area College will take an exit examination prior to graduation. Although the test battery is required, there are no required scores to meet graduation requirements. There is no fee to students for this test.

**PEARSON VUE TESTING** — Mineral Area College is an authorized testing center for technology certification testing through Pearson Vue Inc. This includes Cisco and Microsoft certifications as well as numerous other certifications. Fees and testing times are dependent of the type of certification testing.

Those students wishing to schedule any of these tests should call Nancy Crader, (573) 518-2202. Students should arrive at least ten minutes prior to the test and bring a picture ID (required).

The following changes in Math Course Placement Scores will be effective as of Spring 2008:

1. The ACT math score for placement into College Algebra will be lowered to 22.
2. The ACT math score for placement into Foundations of Mathematics will be raised to 22.
3. The ACT math score for placement into Intermediate Algebra will be lowered to 17.
4. COMPASS scores will be adjusted to correspond to the new ACT math scores.

## REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

### Enrollment Categories:

- ① **First-Time Student** — An applicant who has not completed any college-level course work since high school graduation. Students who complete summer course work after high school graduation, but who have already been admitted to the college, are still considered first-time freshmen.
- ② **Transfer Student** — Any applicant who attended another institution of higher education since high school graduation and before applying to Mineral Area College.
- ③ **Returning Student** — Any applicant who has previously earned at least one hour of credit at Mineral Area College.
- ④ **Continuing Student** — A student who is currently enrolled at Mineral Area College and has not had a break in enrollment (excluding summer session).
- ⑤ **Dual Enrollment Student** — Any student who is a junior or senior (at least age 16) and wants to complete Mineral Area College course work while attending their high school.
- ⑥ **Senior Scholar** — Senior citizens can register for free courses as part of Mineral Area College's Senior Scholar Program. Through the program, senior citizens can audit any college-level course for free at any Mineral Area College campus, paying only for textbooks and other appropriate fees. The courses are taken on a not-for-credit basis, so there's no need to take final exams or other tests. The program is open to residents of the service region, age 65 and older.

**International Student** — An applicant who is a citizen of a country other than the United States who wishes to attend Mineral Area College. Consult the current Mineral Area College Catalog or [www.MineralArea.edu](http://www.MineralArea.edu) for details.

## ❶ First-time College Student Checklist

**Step 1** — Complete an application for admission, which may be downloaded from the Web at [www.MineralArea.edu](http://www.MineralArea.edu).

Your application must be completely filled out. If it is incomplete, you will not be allowed to register.

**Step 2** — Apply for Financial Aid, if needed.

**Step 3** — Request your high school to send the Admissions Office an official high school transcript.

**Step 4** — Have your official ACT or COMPASS scores reported to Mineral Area College. This can be done at the time you register to take the test. If you did not arrange to have your scores sent to Mineral Area College, check with your high school counselor to see if your scores are on your high school transcript. Scores listed on high school transcripts are acceptable. If your high school does not list scores on transcripts, additional copies of ACT scores are available from:

If you have completed a GED, request the State Department to mail copies of your score to the Admissions Office. It is unacceptable to submit a student copy. If you completed your GED in Missouri, the Admissions Office has transcript request forms you may use to request your scores from Jefferson City.

**Step 5** — Upon receipt of requested admission data, you will be admitted and sent registration information. An academic adviser will help you plan your class schedule and answer questions concerning your education. It is important to remember all admission data must be submitted before you are eligible to register for classes and meet with an adviser.

## ❹ Continuing Student Checklist

### 5 Dual Enrollment

Academically talented high school students may be admitted to take college courses before high school graduation. A regular application for admission must be submitted along with a high school transcript and ACT or COMPASS scores. Students interested in Dual Enrollment should read the section on First-Year Admission.

### 6 Senior Scholars

Senior citizens can register for free courses as part of Mineral Area College’s Senior Scholar Program. Through the program, senior citizens can take any college-level course for free, on a not-for-credit basis, at any Mineral Area College campus. The program is open to residents of the service region, age 65 and older.

All courses offered by Mineral Area College are available to senior citizens provided there is space available in the class. Participants are required to follow college policies regarding audit courses, meet all prerequisites and show proof of age and service-region residency when registering for courses. While tuition is waived, senior scholars are responsible for a one-time admissions fee, textbooks, lab fees and other course materials.

Senior Scholar registration for fall courses will be held Aug. 18, 1-3 p.m. Registration will be held in the Registrar’s Office, located in Student Services in the Arts and Science Building.

### Campus Housing—College Park

## POLICIES, INFORMATION YOU SHOULD KNOW

### Change of Class Schedule

After the first three days of fall classes, no classes may be added without the appropriate dean’s permission. Contact the Office of Student Services to add or drop classes. Students enrolled at outreach centers should contact the outreach center coordinator.

Courses dropped during the first 12.5 percent of the semester are not entered on the student’s permanent record. After 12.5 percent of a semester term has passed, the student may follow regular withdrawal procedures to drop any class up to the time that 75 percent of the term or semester is completed. Regardless of whether he/she was passing or failing at the time, a “W” (Withdrawal) will be entered upon his/her record. Any drop completed after 75 percent of a term has passed will result in a grade of “F”. Students should refer to the current academic calendar to determine the exact date when classes may still be dropped with a grade of “W”.

When the student withdraws from a class or from Mineral Area College, his or her record will show a “W”, whether the student was passing or failing at the time. The withdrawal slip must be fully processed within the first 75 percent of the term.

### Before You Drop A Class,

#### Ask Yourself:

- If you receive financial aid, will dropping the class affect your financial status?
- If you need 12 hours (six hours for summer term) or more for insurance, will dropping this class affect your eligibility?
- Have you talked to your instructor about dropping the class?
- Is this a prerequisite for another course you need later?

❑ Will dropping the course delay **graduation** or **transfer** plans?

❑ Is the course you're considering dropping going to be offered again when you need it? Some courses are only offered one semester a year. It may be another year before you can enroll in this course.

❑ Are you working too many hours? If your part-time job is affecting your study time, it is likely that by just cutting down your work hours, you will be able to do better in class.

❑ If you're dropping a math or English course, have you tried the math or writing labs for help? These labs are located on the second floor of the Cozean Library in the Learning Center. They can provide **free tutoring** to help you through difficult times.

Special services are available for students with disabilities, students who are academically or economically disadvantaged, or students using English as a second language. EXCEL also provides a variety of support services for those who are eligible.

If all else fails and you need to drop a course, be sure you complete all paperwork for withdrawal. Drop forms are available in Student Services. Students enrolled at outreach centers should contact the center director to obtain the appropriate paperwork.

## Repeat of a Course

A student who received a grade of "C" or below in a given course may repeat the course to raise his/her grade point average. When a course is repeated, the first grade remains on the transcript but only the latter grade will be counted for graduation or in computing grade points. Students may not repeat a lower level course that serves as a prerequisite for a course that was already completed by the student with a "C" or better. For example, if a student receives a grade of "C" in MAT113 and subsequently completes MAT123 in a following term with a grade of "C", the student is not allowed to repeat MAT113 in a future semester.

Notification of dismissal for evening classes will be made to the same media after 3 p.m.



## Campus Bookstore

The campus bookstore is located in the Student Center and is open from 7:30 a.m.-7 p.m., Monday-Thursday, and 7:30 a.m.-3 p.m. Friday (Saturdays are by-notice only).

For your convenience, textbooks will also be available for purchase at the outreach centers. A student's course schedule is required to purchase textbooks at the beginning of the term. Payment is expected at the time of purchase. The bookstore accepts cash, checks, Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover credit cards; and approved financial aid accounts as payments.

A receipt is required for refunds. Refund policies and deadlines are provided at the time of purchase.



## Web Services

### How to Apply:

You can complete and submit an Application for Admission in one session or multiple sessions, saving the portions you have previously completed. There is a different application for former MAC students and students who have earned MAC credit while enrolled in high school. All applications may be found at [www.MineralArea.edu](http://www.MineralArea.edu).

### Register and Pay for Classes, Find Information About Your Account: Student Information System (SIS)

With MAC's online Student Information System (SIS), current and prospective students can check MAC's catalog and each semester's course schedule. The data is current and indicates the seat count at any time in a course. An ID or PIN is not required to access the Course Catalog or Course Schedule.

SIS also lets students register and pay for classes, and access academic and personal information (student schedule, transcript, financial aid information and student billing).

Students must use their Social Security number (ID) and PIN (Personal Identification Number) to access their personal information. Initial PINs are created by using date of birth. Students will be prompted to change the PIN to something unique to them. This becomes the PIN number for future access. SIS operates in a secure environment.

### Reserve and Buy Textbooks:

Students can check the price or order textbooks online. Fall textbooks can be reserved online beginning July 18. Reserved books will be available in the store beginning Aug. 7. The first day of Fall 2008 books sales is Aug. 7. The last day to return books for a full refund is Aug. 29.

A student's course schedule is required to purchase textbooks. Payment is expected at the time of purchase. The bookstore accepts cash; checks; Visa, MasterCard and Discover credit cards; and approved financial aid accounts as payments.

### Weather-Related Cancellations:

In addition to consulting the media listed on this schedule (see "Inclement Weather Policy"), cancellations may also be found on MAC's home page.

### Take a Class:

You just need access to the Internet, anywhere will do. In a Web-based class, you get your assignments and read supplemental lecture or discussion materials. A discussion forum (bulletin board) helps you communicate with the instructor and class. You might need appropriate software. Check the class description for details.

In addition to textbooks, the bookstore also carries reference materials, software, college supplies, gift items and college imprinted merchandise.

## Wellness Center

The Wellness Center is open to students enrolled in a Wellness Course and to community members who enroll. All students must report to the center within the first week of classes to obtain a syllabus and course information.

## Attendance

A student may be dropped for non-attendance from a course due to excessive absences. Mineral Area College policy states a student will be dropped after two weeks of consecutive absences which occur during the first 75 percent of the term. Individual faculty members may define "excessive absence" differently, such as three absences per semester, for specific courses, resulting in a drop slip being issued by the instructor. The student should determine what the definition is in each course by referring to the course syllabus.

## Parking

Students should obtain a copy of Mineral Area College's Traffic and Parking Regulations pamphlet when they enroll. Parking regulations are enforced 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Students may park in any marked student parking lot (see map). No student is allowed to park in the faculty/staff parking lot. This action will result in a \$25 fine for each offense. A complete list of parking and traffic offenses and fines is listed in the Traffic and Parking Regulations pamphlet.

Students with disabilities are required to contact the ACCESS Office, (573) 518-2152, for a special permit.

Questions about campus parking policy should be directed to the Dean of Students at (573) 518-2262.

## Identification Cards

Student photo identification cards are obtained at the time of textbook purchase. Returning students may have their cards validated for the fall 2008 term.

## Grades

Students may access their transcript and view their grades via the Student Information System (see "Web Services", left) using their PIN at [www.MineralArea.edu](http://www.MineralArea.edu). Grade reports are not automatically mailed to students (unless specifically requested). Students needing help with their PIN number should contact the Registrar's Office, (573) 518-2130, or e-mail [srich@MineralArea.edu](mailto:srich@MineralArea.edu) or [lhuffman@MineralArea.edu](mailto:lhuffman@MineralArea.edu).

Fall 2008 grades should be available via Web by Dec. 17.

## Verification of Enrollment

If you need verification of enrollment for the current semester, complete a verification request form available in the Registrar's Office or at [www.MineralArea.edu](http://www.MineralArea.edu). This form must include the student's signature. Verification of enrollment forms are usually completed after classes have been in session at least one week. Please allow three days processing time.

## Change of Address

Any student who has an address or telephone number change should immediately complete an Address/Residency Change form in the Business Office of the Arts & Sciences Building in order to receive updates, information, etc. Students enrolled at outreach centers should contact the center coordinator for the Address/Residency Change form.

## Graduation Application

Students are responsible for applying for a degree and/or certificate; the college does not automatically award degrees or certificates. The graduation application is available in the Student Services office reception area of the Arts and Sciences Building, from any outreach center coordinator, or on the Web ([www.MineralArea.edu](http://www.MineralArea.edu)).

The graduation application and a completed degree or certificate plan must be submitted to the Registrar's Office by **Sept. 15 for December 2008 graduation**. All degree/certificate applicants are charged a one-time, non-refundable \$40 processing fee, due at the time of application.

Seminars are held each semester explaining Mineral Area College's graduation process. Students receive e-mails from the director of assessment regarding the dates and times of the seminars.

An annual commencement exercise is held at the close of the spring semester. Spring graduates are required to participate in graduation exercises unless excused by the dean of the respective division.

Summer/Fall graduates will receive a letter of invitation to participate in the spring ceremony. The letters will be issued by the dean's office in charge of your specific degree/certificate.

Students must be measured for their caps and gowns in the Bookstore and should watch the bulletin board and Web site for dates. Completion of an Outcomes Assessment (exit) Exam is required of all graduates. Students will be notified of the test dates near the end of the fall semester.

Students should direct questions about graduation to the Registrar's Office, (573) 518-2130.

## ALTERNATIVE AND DISTANCE LEARNING COURSES

Alternative and distance learning courses include telecourses, Internet courses, and interactive television (ITV) courses.

### Interactive TV Courses

Mineral Area College currently offers several courses via ITV (Interactive Television). ITV is the delivery of instruction to students at outreach centers using teleconferencing equipment that permits two-way audio and visual interaction.

The instructor is at a home site (usually the main campus) and students can see, hear, and communicate with the home-site as well as the other distant sites. This is accomplished by modifying the classrooms to accommodate specially equipped cameras, microphones, and TV monitors.

ITV makes it possible for students to participate in a number of courses that they might not have been able to take on the main campus because of travel restrictions, work schedules, or low enrollment.

### Internet Courses

This format allows students to "attend" classes by logging onto the course's Web page to get assignments and read supplemental lecture or discussion material. A discussion forum (bulletin board) allows for communication with the instructor and other class members.

In most online classes, students are required to actively participate by posting a number of "substantial" messages each day. "Substantial" means of sufficient length and intellectual rigor to put forth an argument, explain a meaningful anecdote, or begin a new conversation thread.

Students must understand that Internet courses are not like correspondence courses in which assignments and other requirements can be done during leisure time. In fact, most on-line courses have substantial requirements each week, just like traditional college courses. Students who fail to meet participation requirements and also fail to turn in required assignments may receive a deduction of their final grade, could receive a grade of an "F" for the course or may be dropped. Students are recommended to refer to the class syllabus for participation and other requirements.

Students taking Web classes need good reading skills (since the instructor is not there in person to explain things or lecture) and writing skills (since questions and comments must be posted in a discussion forum), in addition to familiarity with e-mail and access to the Internet. Appropriate software may also be needed.

Students are requested to e-mail their instructor after enrolling in an online class to establish a link with the instructor, who replies with information about the course, the Web site address, etc. Course information is also provided when students purchase their textbooks from the Bookstore.

While most instructors present tests on-line, in some courses students will have to go to campus or to a designated testing location, such as on campus or at a local high school. The final exam will likely be taken on campus.

## Television Courses

A telecourse is a full-credit course in which material traditionally covered in a classroom setting is delivered via video cassette or DVD lessons.

Perhaps more accurately termed video courses, Mineral Area College's telecourses are offered on video or DVD formats to allow students greater choice in viewing and study time. Most telecourses are filmed in documentary style, rather than a classroom lecture format.

Mineral Area College's telecourses are supervised by staff instructors, to whom students report for orientation and assistance. Students receive a course syllabus with a schedule of assignments and tests. Exams are taken in the Mineral Area College Learning Center. Certain instructors allow exams to be taken at Mineral Area College outreach centers.

Textbooks and telecourse guides for the courses are purchased at the campus bookstore. Video cassettes and DVDs may be checked out at the Cozean Library.

There is a \$35 fee for each telecourse.


